

Graduating Student Checklist

NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER

- Review your validation statement and share with your parents.
- Make sure that you are meeting graduation requirements (see next page).
- Make an appointment to see your Guidance Counsellor to review your validation statement.
- Apply to post-secondary (should apply to at least three schools).
- Apply for housing.
- Complete your community service hours (25 hrs).
- Apply for transcripts to be sent to schools www.nwtstudents.ca
- Check your email regularly! Respond to all deadlines!

CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS AND JANUARY

- Look into scholarships, funding, student financial assistance and budgeting.
- Study for exams!
- Adjust second semester timetable if needed.
- Check your email regularly! Respond to all deadlines!

FEBRUARY AND MARCH

- If travelling during March Break, try and visit a post-secondary campus.
- Check your email regularly! Respond to all deadlines!
- Register for your first year courses as soon as they are available.

APRIL

- Meet with your counsellor and arrange for your mid-semester marks to be forwarded to the schools to which you have applied.
- Community Service hours should be completed by April 1st, 2018.
- Register for your first year courses as soon as they are available.
- Check your email regularly! Respond to all deadlines!

MAY

- Expect to receive notification from post-secondary schools.
- Register for your first year courses as soon as they are available.
- Apply for Student Financial Assistance www.nwtsfa.gov.nt.ca. Check deadlines. Make sure to attend workshop at ESJF!
- Check your email regularly! Respond to all deadlines!

JUNE

- Study for exams.
- Check your email regularly! Respond to all deadlines!

SUMMER

- Make sure that your final transcript is sent to post-secondary school before deadlines.
- Make sure that you have registered in your first year courses and paid your tuition.
- Check your email regularly! Respond to all deadlines!
